#### What is "Business Cares"?

Business Cares is an initiative that was created together by Huntsville Hospital Foundation Board and Staff in the efforts to recruit local businesses to give to their hospital and to build on its' already supportive partners. We know that Huntsville is made up of small to medium businesses and that it enables businesses to give and enjoy the benefits and recognition of a larger "campaign" with a brand of its own. Business Cares is a way for local businesses of all sizes to join others in the community toward a common goal of Healthcare for *Life*. Here.

#### Who is on the Committee and how was it Created?

The committee is made up of Foundation Board members and staff. The Drive Muskoka employee team across three automotive dealerships raises funds for various charities including Huntsville Hospital. Management matches their gifts and sometimes even doubles the donation. Contributions come from individuals, special events and management donations. Drive Muskoka raised and donated \$150,000 to Huntsville Hospital last year.



Employees work as a team by supporting the 'Growing Women's Health' Campaign. It provides customers with an opportunity to purchase and personalize women's health icons, and 100% of the proceeds are directed to local women's health organizations. Employees also band together to hold special events such as bake sales and silent auctions to raise funds.
